Heritage Senior Living to hold Fundraiser Walk Benefiting the Alzheimer's Association

Residents from five Heritage communities will walk in the June 24 event in New Berlin

WEST ALLIS, WISCONSIN (June 22, 2017) — Heritage Senior Living, which operates 14 senior living communities throughout Wisconsin, will hold a Heritage Hike Fundraiser Walk on Saturday, June 24, with proceeds benefiting the Alzheimer's Association. The event, which will take place along Heritage Deer Creek's ¼-mile walking path (3585 S. 147th Street in New Berlin), is a mini walk in advance of the larger Milwaukee County Walk to End Alzheimer's on September 17, in which Heritage residents will also take part.

"Heritage Senior Living is actively committed to raising funds for the Alzheimer's Association throughout the year," said Pierre Verger, vice president of operations for Heritage Senior Living. "This pre-walk is just another way to show our support for the organization and their fight against Alzheimer's."

Registration for the event will begin at 10:30 a.m. on June 24, with the walk directly after from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Roughly 125 residents from five Heritage communities – in New Berlin, West Allis, Greenfield, Menomonee Falls and Waukesha – are currently committed to walking, with approximately 50 members of the community are expected to join them. Funds will be raised through sponsorship of the walkers, as well as through the sale of food, drink and raffle tickets, resident-made dog biscuits and T-shirts for tie-dying.

Representatives from the Alzheimer's Association will be on hand for the event, and local businesses and organizations will be set up along the path to greet walkers and provide water. In addition to the walk itself, the event will also feature live entertainment, a brat fry, and a raffle, with prizes donated by local businesses. Prizes will also be awarded to the best decorated hiker, walker and wheelchair.

Heritage Senior Living is dedicated to the care of individuals with Alzheimer's and related dementias, and currently has 10 memory care communities across the state, in addition to independent, assisted and enhanced assisted living communities.
